#### The Aims of MUWG II: MADIMAH

- Building on the existing Migration and Urbanisation Working Group publications, the overall aim of the working group is, *using existing data* of twelve HDSS sites in Africa and Asia, to analyse *migration and health dynamics* through *analysis-oriented longitudinal data management training* and the development of a *longitudinal comparative analysis framework*.
- The working group expected outputs or products are:
- 1. Publicly available standardized biographical datasets,
- 2. Routine basic demographic equation indicators,
- 3. Improved metadata including data quality indicators,
- 4. Best practice guidelines for longitudinal data management and analysis,
- 5. Peer-reviewed publications
- 6. International conference presentations, and
- 7. Migration and health policy recommendations.
