

INDEPTH Mission

(a) To harness the collective potential of the world's community-based longitudinal demographic surveillance initiatives in resource constrained countries (b) to provide a better, empirical understanding of health and social issues, and (c) to apply this understanding to alleviate the most severe health and social challenges ... Looking at the INDEPTH Objectives...

- To support and strengthen the ability of INDEPTH centres to conduct longitudinal health and demographic studies in defined populations. (Yes, we are doing this quite well)
- To facilitate the translation of INDEPTH findings to maximise impact on policy and practice. (Not too well)
- To facilitate and support research capability strengthening relevant to INDEPTH activities (We need to do more).
- To stimulate and co-ordinate multi-site applications to research funding bodies for specific research activities. (We are trying our best – some success)

INDEPTH Scientific Vision 2010

- The Network will conduct studies to:
 - > quantify the dynamics of populations in low and middle income countries
 - understand and address their determinants and their implications for health and wellbeing
 - > evaluate the impact of interventions and health systems on health and survival in different contexts
- Will achieve this through:
 - > the generation and analysis of multi-site, longitudinal, population-based demographic and cause-of-death data



INDEPTH's Vision

(a) INDEPTH will be an international platform of sentinel demographic sites (b) that provides health and demographic data and research to enable developing countries to set health priorities and policies based on longitudinal evidence. (c) INDEPTH's data and research will guide the cost effective use of tools, interventions and systems to ensure and monitor progress towards national goals.
